SOUTHWEST FLORIDA COMMUNITY FOUNDATIONS ANNOUNCE NEW DATE FOR "ON THE TABLE SWFL" INITIATIVE TO STRENGTHEN COMMUNITIES March 30, 2023 mealtime conversations seek to unite residents, inspire solutions

Fort Myers, FL – November 21, 2022 – Charlotte Community Foundation, Collaboratory, and Collier Community Foundation today jointly announced the rescheduling of the regional civic engagement conversations, On the Table SWFL, for Thursday, March 30, 2023. On the Table SWFL will provide a forum for thousands of neighbors, colleagues, friends, and new acquaintances to gather over small, mealtime conversations throughout the region to share their stories and generate ideas to create a more sustainable and vibrant Southwest Florida.

On the Table SWFL takes on renewed importance after Hurricane Ian delivered devastating impacts affecting most in the region. Through these gatherings, Southwest Floridians have a place to discuss ideas for solutions to social challenges important to them – issues like the environment, stable and attainable housing, education, workforce development, rebuilding after Hurricane Ian, or anything else on their minds.

"There has never been a more important time in Southwest Florida for all of us to come together and chart our path forward," expressed Terry Mazany, chief collaboration officer at Collaboratory, speaking on behalf of the three community foundations. "While the stakes are high, the possibilities are even greater and the voice of each and every one of us matters."



Anyone across the region can host an *On the Table SWFL* session, and everyone is welcome to join the conversation and have their voices heard. The topics, issues, and ideas discussed during each conversation are completely organic, driven by what matters to each group of participants as well as the community opportunities and challenges most important to them. These mealtime conversations can take place in homes, backyards, at local restaurants, schools, community centers, places of worship, libraries, offices, retail establishments – literally, anywhere a host chooses. They can be sit-down, catered, picnic, or potluck – completely up to each host.

The inaugural *On the Table SWFL* initiative, produced by Collaboratory in October 2019, welcomed more than 1,500 participants. In 2023, Collaboratory is partnering with Collier Community Foundation and Charlotte Community Foundation to ensure that even more Southwest Florida voices have the opportunity to be heard.

Following the conversations, Florida Gulf Coast University will survey *On the Table SWFL* participants to capture themes and identify region-wide social priorities in an impact report that will be shared broadly. Moving forward, the foundations pledge to work together on issues identified through On the Table SWFL conversations to create a more sustainable and vibrant Southwest Florida.
